Moving into the summer we have some business to attend to. Your membership dues come up this month and all members should be renewing by June 30th for another year. We have a cut-off form on the last page of the newsletter for your convenience. Should you be a new member in the past year, we will prorate you on your renewal and you will be given credit for the months paid. In any case, unless your membership says you are paid through June 30th, 2011, **YOUR DUES ARE DUE!** Also of importance, is your **VOTE**. That means **Vote** in our own election of officers, and **Vote** in your town elections. There are some flyers enclosed pertaining to some issues that will be voted on. These flyers are for your information. We are not suggesting that you vote for any particular warrant article. The exemption to that is the Undesignated Discretionary Funds that both towns have to allocate. **In that case we are** trying to influence you since both towns have put on the ballot (for your vote) potential funds to be given to the Center to match the Kennebec Bank Huntington Common Foundation Grant for \$7,500. Between the two towns we will come close to matching what the Bank is offering us. A YES vote

won't change your taxes any but will help us collect on the KBK Grant and be one step closer to putting in a generator. Also, F.Y.I., the 'matching Grant' challenge that was run a few months ago, resulted in us having enough money to not just buy new dishes & new pots and pans, but we have just had a wonderful commercial grade convection oven installed. As to voting in our own officers' election, Joe Allara, Kathy Chase & Paul Weiner have terms that will be up in June and all of them have indicated that they will run for re-election. They will be running as incumbents and stand on their record of service to date. Should you have any questions you can call the Center and the office will be glad to give you their personal phone numbers. We mention this in case you are new members and haven't had any dealings with these officers or possibly don't know of the service they have given in the past. Since no one to date has offered their name in contention, unless there is write in candidates from the floor, the standing officers will be re-elected at the annual meeting on Tue. June 8th, 2010 @ 4pm.
